UNDER 15 GIRLS SOCCER REPORT

The Albury High School Under 15 Girls Soccer Team have been competing in the Bill Turner Trophy since the beginning of term 2.

The Bill Turner Trophy is a competition that includes up to 400 schools from Northern Queensland all the way down to Melbourne. During term 2, the girls defeated several teams from the Riverina including a 5-2 win against Xavier High School, a 3-0 (forfeit) against James Fallon High School, a 6-3 win against Cootamundra High School and a 2-0 win against The Riverina Anglican College (Wagga).

These results meant we had qualified for the final 32 and 16 rounds at the 'festival of soccer' held over two days at Glen Park in Albury. The festival was held on Tuesday 7 August and Wednesday 8 August and included schools travelling from Canberra, Melbourne, Cowra, Griffith and Albury.

Our round of final 32 opponent on Tuesday was Marian College from Griffith. Albury took an early lead with Lisa Cary scoring in the first minute of the game. Unfortunately a lapse in concentration midway through the first half allowed Marian College to score an equaliser and we went into half time locked at one all. In the second half, the girls played with a lot of heart but unfortunately were no match for some of the more skilful players at Marian College and we ended up conceding two late goals to lose the match 3-1. There were some fine

performances by Anouk O'Regan in central midfield and Ella McFarlane in defence who battled hard for Albury.

Day two of the festival and Albury were to play St Clare's College (Canberra) in the round of 16-consolation match. We were greeted by a cold and very wet day when we arrived at Glen Park and it was quite difficult to generate some motivation during the warm up. However, once the match started the girls lifted and played, in this coach's expert opinion, one of the performances of the festival. Despite the miserable conditions and saturated pitch, we easily defeated the more fancied school from Canberra 6-1. Lisa Cary and Ava Tuksar both scored two goals and there were single goals to Sophie Cary and Anouk O'Regan.

Unfortunately, the girls are now out of the tournament and Lisa, Ella, Anouk, Gerty, Netaya and Chelsea have played their last U15 games and will progress to the senior squad next year. The rest of the girls are looking forward to going a little deeper into the competition next year.

ATTENTION PARENTS AND CARERS: CHANGES TO SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY AND ASSOCIATED GUIDELINES

The NSW Department of Education has revised the School Uniform Policy and associated guidelines following an extensive review and consultation process, including with the NSW Parents and Citizens Association. The revised School Uniform Policy requirements include that:

- all students have the opportunity to access the full range of school activities, including physical activities while wearing a school uniform

- girls must have the option to wear shorts and pants
- consideration is given to cost and how to assist families, including for schools to inform parents how they can access financial support to purchase school uniform items.

The revised School Uniform Policy and associated guidelines can be found at the link: [School Uniform Policy](#).

Where changes are required to a school's uniform, there must be formal consultation with students, teachers and other staff, parents or carers, and the school community (including the Parents and Citizens' Association). Parents and carers should be given up to 3 years to comply with any changes.

Our school expects students to wear their uniform during school hours, while travelling to and from school and when engaged in school activities out of school hours. **The P&C will be reviewing the revised School Uniform Policy and associated guidelines at the P&C meeting on Tuesday 21 August 2018.**

We hope that you can attend the P&C meeting to support our school in ensuring we meet the requirements of the revised School Uniform Policy. When all students wear our school uniform their personal safety is enhanced and a sense of belonging to our school community is created. A positive school identity is also promoted in our local community.


